Description			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
The Blue4EU International Exchange took place in Cluj-Napoca, Romania, from 5–7 June 2025, bringing together young people from Romania and Italy, along with experts and multipliers, to connect lessons from the past with a European future rooted in fundamental rights and values. Day 1 (5 June – Exploration & Exchange) The program began with introductions and context sharing, followed by a session on adding the EU dimension to the oral history research already carried out in Romania and Italy. In the afternoon, participants explored the Living Library concept, and then close the day with reflections and an intercultural evening to foster connections. Day 2 (6 June – Oral History & Context) Participants embarked on a city exploration of Cluj-Napoca, visiting the “places of the stories” collected by Romanian youth. This was followed by two Oral History sessions: the first on connecting the dots behind personal stories, and the second on linking these stories to their historical contexts, as well as practical aspects of using the methodology of Oral History. The day ended with group reflections and a creative intercultural session in the form of an artistic moment. Day 3 (7 June – Heritage & Community Projects) The final day begun with a cultural excursion to Rîmetea and Colțești villages, including visits to the Turda Salt Mine and Trascău Fortress, where participants experienced the diversity of Transylvanian heritage while reflecting on European identity. In the afternoon, the group took the first steps in planning community projects inspired by their experiences. The event concluded with a final reflection and evaluation session. The exchange involved 43 young participants, experts and stakeholders from Romania, Italy and the Netherlands. Its outcomes contributed to a conclusion report, offering input for future youth engagement projects aimed at promoting EU fundamental rights and combating racism and intolerance.
